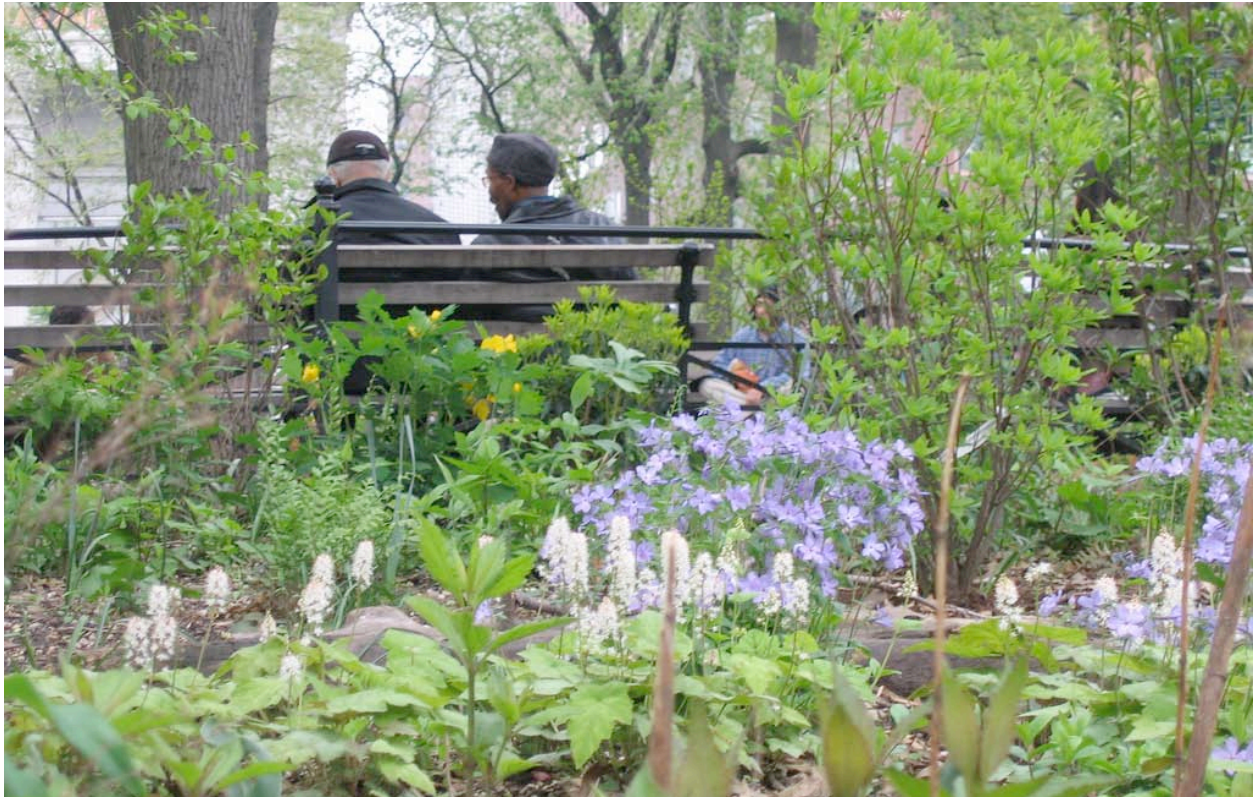


**Native Plant Garden
Union Square Park, New York City**



BACKGROUND & INITIATIVES

The Native Plant Garden at East 15th Street and Union Square West features plants native to the New York City area. Inspired by regional plant communities, it serves as a woodland retreat in the heart of Manhattan.

The garden supports diverse initiatives, including:

Demonstration Home Garden - Inspiring New Yorkers to grow wildflowers. Home garden centers encourage environmentally unsound practices – use of gas powered tools, addition of fertilizers, soil loss, excessive water needs, planting of annuals, etc. By contrast, the Native Plant Garden is cultivated naturally and invites wildlife through low impact, earth friendly strategies for greening the garden. These are easily replicated at home at smaller scales – even a in a window box!

Model Public Landscape – Demonstrating thoughtful, sustainable design in a public park. Consideration was given to ecological relationships, floristic compatibility, and seasonal interest, as well as beauty and user-friendliness. The landscape emphasizes perennials. In one of the most intensively used areas of the city, the garden also provides a unique opportunity for New Yorkers to meet their foliar neighbors, a reminder of their biophilic connection to the natural heritage of the Big Apple.

Habitat Haven for Wildlife - Creating habitat havens for birds, bees, butterflies and other critters. Not only are native plants critical sources of food and lodging for wildlife, in some cases they are essential to their very existence. Most of our bird species feed their young exclusively insects, which are sustained by the tender leaves of native plants.

Place-based Nature Education in Local Schools - Collaborating with local schools to engage students in the outdoor classroom. Numerous studies underscore the benefits of nature to children. We are partnering with schools city-wide to teach them about the nature that's around them. We are also developing a curriculum for teachers to use the garden as an ecological lab.

NOT-FOR-PROFIT PROJECT

Designed and administered by Marielle Anzelone, the Native Plant Garden is a not-for-profit project, operating under the fiscal sponsorship of Open Space Institute, Inc., based in New York City, as part of its Citizen Action Program. In 2008 the garden received its first grant from Hudson River Foundation's NYC Environmental Fund. Since 2006, the garden has received over \$21,000 towards garden materials and education and outreach programs through grants, public partnerships, and private donations.
